**HUSBAND GIVEN 9 MONTH SUSPENDED SENTENCE FOR ASSAULTING HIS WIFE** 

On 29 July 2007 the Baucau District Court issued a decision in a case of domestic

violence which occurred in Ossu, Viqueque in 2006 involving the defendant Agusto C.

Guterres. The hearing was presided over by a single Judge Dra. Edite Palmira dos Reis

and the Prosecution Unit was represented by Dra. Maria Ivonia and the Defendant was

represented by his lawyer Dr. Augusto Guterres from UCM Baucau.

In her decision the judge stated that in January 2007 the Defendant deliberately and

unlawfully committed an act of light maltreatment against the victim Anacleta Maria Belo,

who happened to be his wife. In a hearing conducted on 25 June 2007 the defendant

accepted all of the charges ascribed to him in the prosecutor's indictment and admitted

that he had committed light maltreatment against his wife. As a result of the maltreatment

the victim was treated in hospital for 3 days.

The Baucau District Court convicted the defendant for the commission of the

aforementioned act pursuant to Article 351 (1) and Article 356 (1) of the Indonesian Penal

Code which relates to light treatment committed by a husband against his wife. In her

decision the judge sentenced the defendant to a suspended term of 9 months and

ordered him to pay court costs of US \$5. The justification for the suspended sentence was

that the defendant had been polite throughout the trial, had no prior convictions, had

pleaded guilty as well as evidence of an agreement/reconciliation between the defendant

and victim (between the husband and wife which was signed by both of them in their

capacity as defendant and victim) that had been submitted by the defence during the trial.

The Judge also took into consideration the amicable agreement entered into by the victim

and defendant several weeks after the incident. The judge may consider such matters

pursuant to Article 2.4 of the RDTL Constitution which basically states that the State shall

recognize and value the norms and customs of East Timor that are not contrary to the

Constitution and to any legislation dealing specifically with customary law.

After reading out the decision the judge explained that pursuant to Article 282 of the

Criminal Procedure Code, the court shall, in a convicting sentence, specify the grounds

on which the choice and extent of the penalty applied are based, indicating, where

applicable, when and how the sentence is going to be served, other duties imposed upon

the convict and the duration thereof, as well as the status of the convict in regards to any

restrictive measures.

After hearing the sentence the defendant and his counsel stated that they accepted the

sentence as fair and in accordance with the applicable law. JSMP did not receive any

confirmation from the victim who was not present for the announcement of the sentence.

JSMP believes that the court's decision was made pursuant to principles of justice and

the applicable laws in Timor Leste; both the Constitution and other organic laws. JSMP

recommends for the competent agencies to immediately pass a law on domestic violence

so that such cases can be dealt with specifically without having to refer to the Indonesian

Penal Code which is too general.
